

ABOUT FLIGHT 300

Hall of Famer Isaac Bruce launched the Isaac Bruce Foundation in 2006 which focuses on health, wellness, nutrition, fitness and education. Through his foundation, Isaac reaches out to youth and teaches them at an early age the importance of a healthy lifestyle with an emphasis on education.

The Isaac Bruce Foundation's Flight 300 Program provides transportation to college bound students in need. When Isaac graduated high school in Florida, he had a scholarship to a junior college in California, but he needed to find a way to get there. He was gifted \$300 for a flight and is now making that difference for students in need. As a way to pay it forward, Isaac created the Flight 300 Program. To qualify, students must be in need of a one-way domestic flight, submit proof of financial need, as well as submit acceptance and enrollment at an accredited college or university.

The Flight 300 program covers the cost of one-way airfare, bus, or other transportation for a student with all the pieces in place to attend college but unable to afford to get there. The program also helps with the cost of transportation to the airport, covers the cost to check bags, and helps with the cost of transportation from the airport to campus. Because the students are generally allowed to travel with very few items, each Flight 300 Program recipient also receives a gift card to purchase essentials such as bedding and towels.

Applications are available at www.isaacbruce.org. The Isaac Bruce Foundation has not turned away any students for this program and it continues to grow each year since it began in 2014. The gap bridged by this program is unique and is the only known such program in the country.





"Flight 300 is a program I am very passionate about," Bruce said. "Because of my personal experience, I understand the value of this program. For many students, the money required for travel is often enough to be a barrier that keeps them from continuing their education. We are excited to be able to bridge this gap."

One of the Flight 300 Program students explained, "I was accepted to Yale University on a full ride but the cost to get to New Haven was more than my family could afford. The Isaac Bruce Foundation provided a way for me to get there."

Recipients for this program are typically first-generation low-income college students (FGLI). Ninety three percent of applicants have a full ride or more than 90% of their college tuition covered based on financial need. Seven percent of applicants have an athletic scholarship. Financial aid offices at Harvard, Yale, Stanford, Brown, and more have begun sharing information on the program with their FGLI students. We believe as more schools begin to share Flight 300 information with their FGLI students, the program will continue to grow at a rapid pace.

In 2023, Flight 300 provided transportation to or from 46 states in the United States. The program is truly a national program helping students all across the United States.

The Isaac Bruce Foundation is committed to helping each qualified student receive transportation and not turning anyone away. In the past three years, the IBF has provided transportation for 967 students. The average cost per student including airfare, ground transportation, checking bags, and a gift card for essentials is approximately \$400/student. In 2023 and 2024, American Airlines donated 5,000,000 miles to help with the cost of flights.

This year, the Isaac Bruce Foundation is providing transportation for a RECORD 331 students! As the program continues to grow, the IBF is working to provide additional opportunities for recipients. Networking events, internship opportunities, and mentoring opportunities are a few of the opportunities we are looking to provide to current and former recipients.
